PRESENTATIONS

PRESENTATION OF RESOLUTION

Hospital Task Force Mr. McSwain informed Council that the task force met on Monday, April 7 and the Palmetto Health Alliance and Richland Memorial hospital boards met on April 8 to consider the Memoranda and Lease Amendment. a. 03-19MA, Charles Baker, D-1 to M-1, warehouse park, 09405-02-04, Blue Ridge Terrace East of Monticello Road — Council gave third reading approval to a zoning amendment that changes the property from D-1 to M-1. ACTION: LEGAL/PLANNING

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- b. 03-28MA, Mike Deloach, RU to RS-1, single family detached s/d,
 02600-05-10 & 03500-01-32, W. Shady Grove Rd. adjacent to Ashford s/d Council gave third reading approval to a zoning amendment that changes the property from RU to RS-1. ACTION: LEGAL/PLANNING
- c. 03-37MA, Roger Crouch, C-1 to C-3, establish a retail business, 06012-02-23, north side of St. Andrews Rd, east of I-26 Council gave third reading approval to a zoning amendment that changes the property from C-1 to C-3. ACTION: LEGAL/PLANNING
- d. 03-38MA, Roger Crouch, C-1 to C-3, establish a retail business, 06012-02-24, north side of St. Andrews Rd. east of I-26 Council gave third reading approval to a zoning amendment that changes the property from C-1 to C-3. ACTION: LEGAL/PLANNING
- e. 03-39MA, Cheryse Tapp, RU to C-1, mixed use commercial development, 02415-02-02, NE corner of Bickley Rd. and Dutch Fork Rd. north of the railroad Council gave third reading approval to a zoning amendment that changes the property from RU to C-1. ACTION: LEGAL/PLANNING
- f. Ordinance providing for the Issuance and Sale of Sewer System General Obligation Refunding Bonds Council approved third reading of an ordinance authorizing the issuance and sale of Sewer System General Obligation Refunding Bonds, not to exceed \$6,780,000. ACTION: LEGAL, FINANCE, TREASURER, AUDITOR
- g. Ordinance providing for the Issuance and Sale of General Obligation Refunding Bonds Council approved third reading of an ordinance authorizing the issuance and sale of general obligation refunding bonds not to exceed \$26,500,000 to refund the County's outstanding 1994 and 1995 Bonds. Also approved was the issuance and sale of general obligation bonds not to exceed \$2,450,000 to fund the acquisition of vehicles for the Sheriff's Department. ACTION: LEGAL, FINANCE, TREASURER, AUDITOR
- h. Ordinance regarding prohibition of parking truck tractors, etc., with more than two axles Council gave third reading approval to an ordinance prohibiting parking truck tractors in residential areas.
 ACTION: LEGAL/PLANNING

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2. SECOND READING ITEM

- a. Ordinance regarding East Richland County Public Service Commission – Council gave second reading approval to an ordinance authorizing the Commission to incur up to \$13,000,000 of general obligation debt and the levy of ad valorem property taxes in their district to pay debt service. ACTION: LEGAL, FINANCE, TREASURER, AUDITOR
- b. Industrial Park Fund (Appropriation of revenue from Multi-County Industrial Park agency and expenditure associated with CCEDA Collaborative Economics Project) Council gave second reading approval to a budget amendment to add \$95,000 to the Industrial Park Fund. ACTION: BUDGET, FINANCE, TREASURER, AUDITOR
- c. Quitclaim of Gateway Corporate Boulevard to Sisters of Charity Providence Hospitals Council gave second reading approval to an ordinance authorizing the grant of a quitclaim deed as requested without compensation. ACTION: LEGAL/PUBLIC WORKS
- d. Ordinance authorizing deed regarding the Broad River Regional Wastewater Treatment Plan Upgrade Land Purchase —Council gave second reading approval to an ordinance allowing the transfer of ownership rights. ACTION: LEGAL/PUBLIC WORKS, ASSESSOR
- e. **Ordinance regarding budget amendment for Sheriff's Department: Firearms Lab --** Council approved a second reading of a budget amendment in the amount of \$100,000 for the purpose of implementing the capital construction project of the planned firearms lab.
- f. **Ordinance regarding budget amendment for the Black Expo** -- Council approved a \$15,000 appropriation from surplus Accommodations Tax to be designated for the Black Expo
